

小时候,我一直觉得《憨豆先生》是最愚蠢的节目。一个成年人在游泳池里笨拙地模仿跳水动作,在高档餐厅里把龙虾塞进裤兜。他的行为幼稚可笑,毫无章法,仿佛一个不谙世事的孩子,在成人世界的条条框框里横冲直撞。

可是后来,我读了加缪的《局外人》。那时, 我开始思考憨豆先生是否真的只是个"小丑"。

默尔索先生,《局外人》的主人公,是个异类。他不在乎社会期待,不是没有察觉,而是因为不屑。他不愿意妥协说谎,更流露不出真实情感,不是因为刻意压制,而是因为没有。母亲去世,他没有痛哭。神父来访,他不怀虔诚。他的冷漠,是对社会规范的无声反抗,但这种反抗最终使他被真实的情感所排斥。

憨豆先生看起来完全相反。他不收敛自己不是因为选择如此,而是对社会规则几乎毫无察觉。游泳池里,他毫不在意别人的目光,只沉浸于水的清凉高级餐厅里,他不被繁文缛节束缚,而是用自己独特的方式享用美食。他不是消极地拒绝世界,而是以最本能的方式活着。默尔索的反抗是沉默、是冷漠,而憨豆先生的反抗是张扬、是炙热。

他们都是"反抗者",都不愿被社会规则束缚,但他们的方式截然不同。默尔索的冷漠让他成为旁观者,而憨豆先生的"愚蠢"让他成为行动者。

这让我意识到,憨豆先生不是一个简单的喜剧 角色。他不仅仅是一个长不大的孩子,更是一个用 天真对抗世俗的斗士。

他的荒诞,并非源于无知,而是源于一种对"不言自明"的规则的本能抗拒。他的每一次鲁莽的行为,每一次荒唐的尝试,都是一种本能的抗争。他不像默尔索那样消极地拒绝社会,而是用自己的方式在与社会博弈。他或许是不合时宜的,但他的不合时宜不是愚昧,而是一种更为纯粹的生命力。

在中国的主流教育观念下,憨豆先生的"不符合标准""不遵循规则"以及"不懂事"大概率会让他被视为"不可救药"的角色。这样的标签强调的是规范、服从、集体意识,而对于个体的独立思考和挑战精神缺乏足够的重视。在这样的环境里,憨豆先生不会被看作一个"斗士",而只是一个"失败的成年人",一个"长不大的笨蛋"。

但真正的教育,不是培养循规蹈矩的"好学生", 而是激发每个人独立思考的能力。

而我开始庆幸,在我成长的环境,我学会了思考。 BCIS 营造了一个自由的、包容的环境。这里没有标准答案,没有标杆模范,没有冰冷的制度和必须遵从的权威,相反,这里只有对独立思考的鼓励。在这里,我学会了不再简单地接受社会所定义的"聪明"与"愚蠢",学会了去探究它们背后的逻辑。我学会了挑战传统认知框架,去质疑那些看似理所当然的规则。这种思维方式,让我能够重新看待憨豆先生,看到他的不守规矩背后的自由,看到他的荒诞背后的生命力。

有时候,打破常规的"愚蠢",比墨守成规的"聪明"更需要勇气,也更有价值。而这种认知的转变,是我在成长的过程中获得的最宝贵的财富。BCIS就像一块肥沃的土地,给我们提供了生长的空间,让我们能够从不同的角度看待世界,接纳不同的思想,也让我们能够在自由与包容中找到自己独特的声音。它让各式各样的我们生根发芽,也希望我们如我们所是地成长为我们自己的样子。


挑战与成长 📐



the school mascot for the Warriors, is the beloved symbol of pride and unity at BCIS. Designed by Mariana Cui, Class of 2020, LeLe embodies the values of spirit, resilience, and cultural diversity that define our school community. Inspired by international influences and the power of symbolism, Mariana's work on LeLe became a prototype for the icon we cherish today. In this interview, Mariana reflects on her creative journey, the challenges of design, and her thoughts on what it means to contribute to the BCIS legacy.

#### What was school life like before LeLe? What do you think is the importance of having a mascot to represent the school community?

The mascot is a constitutive part of school identity in the U.S., and this is becoming true in schools from other parts of the world, especially international ones. To have a mascot is to adopt the cultural practice of engendering school spirit through shared identity and athletic competition. Personifying the community makes it more endearing, and to go to a school you feel you belong to is a good thing.

#### Why is LeLe a horse?

The concept of LeLe was initially based on the Warriors moniker, but to make a human mascot seemed awkward, so I was told to make it a horse. I had specified the horse to be a warhorse in my own designs to make the Warrior-horse connection more apparent, but even without it, the horse itself is already a cultural motif of warrior prowess in many parts of the world, including China.

#### Was this a solo project? Or was did you collaborate with other students?

Designing the mascot logo was a solo project, but I couldn't have done it without help from my friends in our design club Focus (Bryson, Dayeon, Sarak ). We'd share design feedback with each other, which made the creative process much less wobbly.

#### Can you tell us about the creative process behind Lele's design? What inspired you along the way?

The concept of Lele was initially based on the Warriors moniker, but to make a human mascot seemed awkward, so I was told to make it a horse. I had specified the horse to be a war horse in my own designs to make the Warrior-horse connection more apparent, but even without it, the horse itself is already a cultural motif of warrior prowess in many parts of the world, including China.

#### How did you aim to embed BCIS values and spirit into LeLe's design?

BCIS celebrates culture and internationalism, so I tried to incorporate diverse cultural elements into my design (as a forementioned). In the original design, the BCIS symbol was engrained on the horse helmet, so there's that.

#### What were some challenges you faced while designing LeLe and how did you over come them?

I designed with practicality in mind, so there was a lot of refining and simplifying so that the mascot logo looked good in different sizes. I did a lot of back-and-forth with my design friends, as well as zooming in and out in Photoshop, and inch by inch it worked out in the end.

LeLe is fondly cherished as an iconic symbol of Warriors' pride. Almost every student and teacher adorn their laptops, notebooks, ID cards etc. with Lele stickers. How does it make you feel, having made such a huge impact in the school community?

I want to say that I am very proud, but I don't think I have contributed so much to the image of LeLe today. My design was adopted for a year, and then I was informed by the school that they had reinterpreted my design into their own version, which will be released as the official version. So, in fact, what I designed is a prototype of a trial run LeLe.

#### There are many Warriors who aspire to make a difference in the BCIS community like you did. Do you have any advice or encouragement you'd like to give them?

Do you have any special skills or talents that as students we wouldn't reallyknow about?


*Mr. Finn:* I play the guitar and make music.






中文课结束的时候,我们都一致认同老师就像是我们的朋友,让学习成为一个有趣的游戏!



# My Environmentalismos Story with BCIS

Elsa × Grade 2

My name is Elsa, and I am currently in the second grade at BCIS. This is my seventh year living and learning in the BCIS community. BCIS is a green and environmentally friendly community, and I feel very proud to be a part of BCIS.



When I first entered the kindergarten of BCIS, everything felt so new to me: the beautiful campus, the fun slides, the knowledgeable teachers, and the cute classmates. What fascinated me the most was that we often collected discarded paper boxes together and, under the guidance of our teachers, created various art pieces—cute animals, flowers, and models of the sea world.

When I brought these art works home, my dad and mom were pleasantly surprised, and they have kept these works until now. This sparked a greater awareness of environmental protection in our family. My mom would help me with various crafts, and we even built a secret base using discarded delivery boxes. My dad told me that to sustainably promote a valuable cause, it's essential not only to benefit oneself but also to help more people, and that the best way to do this is through making a profit from a business. When I was very young, I didn't quite understand what this meant.

In August 2023, I became a student in the elementary section of BCIS. I noticed a unique characteristic at BCIS: regardless of how large the events are, we never waste resources. It seemed like everyone had agreed to bring their own water bottles instead of using plastic ones, and the teachers encouraged us not to use balloons and

other non-recyclable materials for event decorations. Everything felt so natural. This is the green campus of my dreams.

There is a beautiful ginkgo tree on campus. The school has hosted many events under this tree, including my favorite—an Eco Market. When I first visited the Eco Market, I noticed that very few people used plastic items; many goods were handmade, and most were reusable.

Soon, I applied to be a student vendor at the Eco Market. I received a table at the Eco Market every month. I discussed with my parents what I should sell. During this time, I learned a lot about business concepts, such as products, marketing, costs, and profits. I love reading, so I wanted to pass on my second-hand books to more people, which aligned with the Eco Market's goals. While preparing my products, I also received support from many publishers, who sent me various sample books. Suddenly, my stall became a sea of knowledge. Before opening, I designed some marketing materials to attract customers. My mom told me that every material had to be accounted for in costs, which added some pressure.

Fortunately, when the market opened, I called out loudly for parents and classmates to come and see. I also designed a lucky draw event. Buyers could participate in a lottery, winning cash prizes or a block gift, plus some "punishment" prizes, like doing five push-ups or hugging their favorite person. More and more people gathered around, which boosted my confidence. I remember that day—I talked so much

my voice nearly went hoarse, but I was happy as more people showed interest in my products and purchased them out of enjoyment. In the end, I made a significant profit, which I donated to a charity.

At that moment, I began to understand that to sustainably pursue something, it cannot just be about consumption; it must create value. For example, earning money allows for further investment, which can help more people and enable larger endeavors.

In April 2024, my mom volunteered for the PTA and initiated BCIS's first ginkgo tree flea market. I became a vendor again. This time, all the vendors sold second-hand goods, which we had to clean and organize in advance. The design and service of the stall, including product pricing, had to be led by the student vendors, with parents unable to participate. The organizers also provided us with special "Lele coins" for the flea market; each completed transaction earned us coins that could be exchanged for BCIS mascots and merchandise.

This time, I learned even more about how to set up a stall and price products. Many of my toys were expensive when I bought them but were sold much cheaper as second-hand items. This not only taught me arithmetic but also helped me better understand the value of reusability.

We had a lot of fun together and learned many things that aren't taught in class. I also made many good friends through the various markets. This is the strength of the BCIS community.


"I love the monster tree". Jiu Jiu




